

# ONE-PAGE GUIDE: HOW TO READ A WAGE DETERMINATION

## What Type of Construction Does the Determination Cover?



There are four possible types of construction that might appear on a determination: **Residential, Building, Highway, or Heavy**. There may even be a description of the construction to which the wage determination applies (as well as any exclusions).

### Types

### Description

Construction Types: Building, Heavy (Heavy and Dredging), Highway and Residential

County: San Diego County in California.

BUILDING CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS; DREDGING PROJECTS (does not include hopper dredge work); HEAVY CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS (does not include water well drilling); HIGHWAY CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS; RESIDENTIAL CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS (consisting of single family homes and apartments up to and including 4 stories)

## What Are the Most Up-to- Date Rates?



Some determinations might have multiple modifications – each with their respective dates. If so, the initial publication date will be denoted as “0” like below. The last one is crucial for identifying the current and correct determination on a project.

## Where Are Classifications and Wage Rates Listed?



The body of the determination lists the classifications and their respective wage rates and fringes. This **Sheet Metal Worker** has a base rate of \$23.32 and fringes of \$7.82 (yellow highlight) – for a total prevailing rate of \$31.14 per hour.

Local Union Number

Internal Processing Number

Classifications are alphabetically ordered according to their union identifiers. They denote the union that was found prevailing when the wage determination was created. The first four letters (yellow underline) indicate the classification; the second part (blue underline) indicates the local union number; the third (orange underline) is an internal processing number used by the DOL; and lastly, the date (highlighted) denotes when the collectively bargained rate took effect.
